Yet Lent is precisely the season of hope, when we turn back to God who patiently continues to care for his creation which we have often mistreated.' He adds: 'This Lenten journey, like the entire pilgrimage of the Christian life, is even now illumined by the light of the resurrection, which inspires the thoughts, attitudes and decisions of the followers of Christ.' This Lent can be a time of hope and renewal for us, as we journey together towards Easter.
